

Changes vs last year

Slowly re-introducing leadership programs & sports:

- soccer started for intermediates, cross-country starting this week for 3 to 7.
- Hopefully basketball season will also go ahead this year. Usually starts in January
- Sports teams are going ahead with modifications e.g., reduced sized games, discouraging spectators
- Grade 6/7 intermediate arts club in the loft, broken into 2 smaller groups
- Library monitor program for upper intermediates starts next week
- Lunch outdoor activity leaders will be starting again e.g., had sidewalk chalk this week
- Chess club has been requested brainstorming on how to run this. Each club needs a teacher sponsor.

Staff & Students

13 classes, just over 300 students - only a handful of spots left in the school **New staff:**

• X - one more supervision aide will be hired full time. This is an additional position M, T, and every other W. So we have 3.5 supervision aides this year vs 3 last year.

 Our top priority continues to be the implementation of the PHO's (Public Health Office's) and the District's Health and Safety guidelines, mandated by the Ministry of Education. The document VSB 2021-2022 Communicable Disease Prevention Plan link is as follows:

- Individual Photo Day is this Tuesday, September 29.
- On September 29, many staff and students will wear an orange shirt to recognize and remember the residential school experience. It was a day to recognize the harm the residential school system did to Indigenous children's sense of self-esteem and well- being, and as an affirmation of our commitment to

ensure that everyone around us matters. September 30th was the date chosen as the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and it also provides educators an opportunity to foster dialogue and deepen their understanding of Indigenous People's histories for the coming school year. Orange Shirt Day is an opportunity for Indigenous and Non- Indigenous people, local governments, schools, and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.

- False Creek will participate in the Terry Fox Run on October 1. We are proud to continue the legacy of one of our country's greatest heroes.
