- **4. Agenda (to be approved) -** motioned by Bradley Gagne, seconded by Roxanne Brooks. Passed unanimously.
- 5. Minutes (to be approved) motioned by Michelle, seconded by Krista. Passed unanimously.
- 6. Guest Speaker "Tech Committee": Jade Lee, teacher librarian and Mr. Watt, Div 3, Grade 5 / 6 teacher
 - iPAD cart used by one class at a time. Also sometimes the resource teacher will borrow an individual iPAD to work with a student.
 - District took all the outdated technology, with the plan to replace them. Older devices are a security risk and cause the WiFi to run more slowly.
 - Not all devices were replaced. There are now only 15 working 8th generation iPADs on the cart, plus approximately 5 iPAD 7th generation minis.
 - Asking for Parent support to replace the iPADs. 100% funds from PAC.
 - Would like to purchase a bundle of 10 iPADs for now, and 10 later in the year to replace the dying minis
 - 30 iPADs would be a "full" class set.
 - Cost = \$4,140 before taxes (\$400 per 9th generation, 64GB iPAD, plus \$14 per iPAD cover). This is for the 10-bundle set.
 - Ms. Donovan will provide pricing for individual laptops.
 - Good time to buy an iPAD set, as we have a new teacher librarian who is very knowledgeable with Apple iPADs. So we can take advantage of her expertise.
 - Roxanne will put this forward to the False Creek Neighbourhood Association.
 (~\$1100 is usually available to the school)

Motion: Target PAC donations for school iPads & draft ask to the Neighbourhood Association for their allocated FCES funds to go towards iPad purchases. Motioned by Michelle, seconded by Bradley. Passed unanimously.

- Welcome back everyone! I hope that you all had a good winter break! We are happy to have all the kids back at school!
- Staff were very busy the first week back in January reviewing health and safety protocols and preparing for a potential functional closure, should one become necessary in the future.
- As a result, some school activities have been cancelled until further notice, including Knitting Club, Climate Action Club, the Grade 7 Friday lunch out and Library Monitors. These activities will be reconsidered in a couple of weeks. Additionally, volunteer activities have been limited to existing arrangements until further notice.
