PAC Meeting Principal's Report - May 17, 2022

• We are pleased to announce that we will once again be able to have Sport's Day for our students. As with many other events, our Sport's Day may look a little different this year than in previous years, but the opportunity to organize this event is very exciting! **Sports Day 2022 will take place on Thursday, June 16.** The students will move from station to station with their whole class, led by their classroom teacher. They will take part in 13 activity stations in the morning. The stations will be run by Grade 8 and 9 volunteers from Kitsilano Secondary School. We will all break for lunch at the regular time. In the afternoon, same grade groups will be called outside for some additional activities, such as relays and a tug-of-war! More details will follow in June!

Will have some colour groups, e.g., for the chant - but participation will be done in class groups not in colour groups.

- Thanks to our False Creek Parent volunteers, Laurel Miles and Travis Musika, for coaching our False Creek Ultimate Frisbee Team this year for grades 4-7 students. Practices are twice per week and games (for grades 5-7 students only) take place every Wednesday until June.
- False Creek has an intermediate Track and Field team this year. They will be practicing at lunch and will participate at the Swangard Track Meet at the beginning of June. Mr. Hanvey is heading this up.
- The Mindfulness and Yoga Club for grade 3 –7 students are being offered to students at lunch hour on Thursdays (beginning on May 5, 2022). Students who are still interested in joining this club can pick up a parent permission form from Ms. Misquitta.
- The Climate Club will go around to classes to do advertising presentations about their TeamSeas fundraiser on June 1st and 2nd. They will be collecting donations on the week of June 6th- 10th. Each division will have a jar to collect the loonies in and these will be returned to Ms. Misquitta on Friday, June 10th.

TeamSeas is a fundraising campaign, initiated by Mark Rober and MrBeast, content creators on YouTube. The campaign's goal is to raise 30 million USD to remove 30 million pounds of trash polluting coastal regions, rivers, and ultimately oceans. The funds raised will go to two organizations, split equally: The Ocean Cleanup and Ocean Conservancy. The Ocean Clean up organization will collect one pound of trash for every dollar collected.
